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ABOUT Our Program

The University Police Partnership
Program allows interns at participating
law enforcement agencies and crime
laboratories, hereinafter referred to as law
enforcement agencies, the opportunity to
participate in ATF's National Integrated
Ballistic Information Network program.
Upon completion of training, interns will be
certified to triage cartridge cases recovered
at crime scenes and enter the selected
cartridge cases into NIBIN. This introduces
interns to Crime Gun Intelligence (CGI)
and allows participants of UPPP to serve
as a force multiplier to resource-strapped
departments.

PROGRAM Requirements

Participating interns must agree to a length of service of two (2) consecutive semesters (or equivalent) to be trained by either the NIBIN National Correlation and Training Center or a NIBIN Authorized Trainer (NAT) in the field. If participating interns can only commit to a single semester (or equivalent), the training must be completed by a NAT in the field.

Interns must be sponsored by a law enforcement agency, at the NIBIN site, and be supervised by an experienced user.

The sponsoring law enforcement agency will initiate all training requests for participating interns.

Interns must be able to commit to 5 consecutive days of training to be considered for the program.

Interns must have an e-mail address issued by the sponsoring law enforcement agency for official correspondence with ATF.

No personal or university issued e-mail addresses will be permitted. As with all other NIBIN users, the intern must be a U.S. citizen to be eligible for database access.

The intern must also complete the following documents, which are required for all NIBIN Users:

- NIBIN Access Form
- Rules of Behavior
- Workstation User Agreement
- Background Check Confirmation
- Application for Training (completed on the intern's behalf)

The sponsoring law enforcement agency must submit a NIBIN Access Form, within five (5) business days of the termination of the internship program, to delete the intern's database access.
