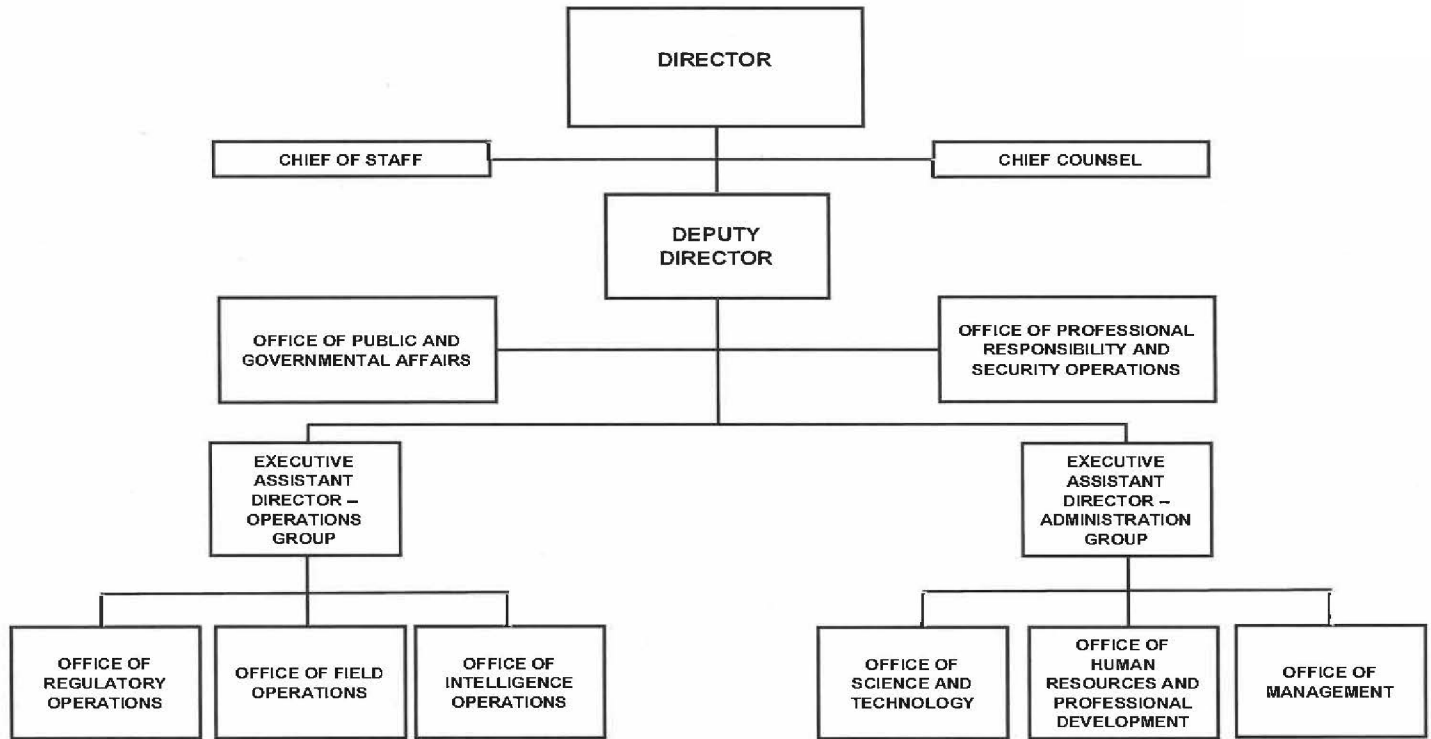


Organizational Chart

1 Bipartisan Safer Communities Act The Bipartisan Safer Communities Act (BSCA), enacted on June 25, 2022, takes meaningful steps to save lives in reducing gun violence and gives law enforcement and prosecutors new tools to prosecute gun traffickers. The BSCA includes multiple provisions that have considerable implications for the ATF's resources requirements in FY 2024. With this request, the ATF will be able to respond to changes resulting from BSCA, such as a refined definition for FFLs, closure of the so-called "boyfriend loophole," and statutes prohibiting firearms trafficking and straw purchasing. The \$71.1 million and 332 positions (100 agents) will build upon investments in FY 2023 and provide resources for the ATF to fully realize the vision of the BSCA for safer communities across America.	332	166	71,120

L. Summary by Grade

Status of Congressionally Requested Studies, Reports, and Evaluations

Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives

1. The Senate Report associated with the FY 2023 appropriations act directs DOJ to submit a report, within 60 days of the enactment of that law, assessing investments in tobacco initiatives in each fiscal year since 2017 and identifying the amounts proposed to be invested in such programs in fiscal year 2022. ATF is directed to immediately comply with this directive per the the joint explanatory statement accompanying Public Law 117–103. Due no later than February 28, 2023.
2. The Senate Report associated with the FY 2023 appropriations act directs DOJ to submit a report, within 60 days of the enactment of this act, that details (1) how many of the total OBRs reflect transactions that occurred before 2002; (2) what year the oldest OBRs are from that are currently maintained in the ATF repository, and (3) for the traces completed in the past 5 years using OBR records, how old the records were that were subject to a trace. Due no later than February 28, 2023.
3. The Senate Report associated with the FY 2023 appropriations act directs DOJ to submit a report, within 90 days of enactment of this act, on how ATF assesses agency records for release under FOIA. Due no later than March 30, 2023.
4. The House Report associated with the FY 2023 appropriations act directs DOJ to produce a report, no later than one year after the enactment of this Act and annually thereafter, to the Committee providing an overview of the e-Trace workload and

operational costs in the fiscal year to best understand the workload and ensure the program is adequately resourced. The report should include the number of personnel allocated to assist with the tracing of firearms and all associated NTC operations and maintenance costs, the total number of trace requests in the fiscal year and a comparison to the prior fiscal year, the number of successfully processed requests and trace completion times, the number of unsuccessful traces with a summary of the reasons for the trace not being completed, and a summary of any resource or funding challenges to the program. Due no later than December 30, 2023

5. The House Report associated with the FY 2023 appropriations act directs ATF in coordination with all Federal partners, to help increase the participation and engagement of law enforcement in the region and to report on Central American Tracing Efforts no later than 180 days after the enactment of this Act. Due no later than April 30, 2023.

6. The House Report associated with the FY 2023 appropriations act directs DOJ to update the Committee on its NIBIN and Crime Gun Intelligence (CGI) presence on the Southwest border; including an increase to Crime Gun Intelligence Centers allotted to Southwest border field offices; improved CGI and information sharing, and expects funding provided in this bill will aid in interdicting crime guns and preventing gun trafficking; to support efforts to expand the use of NIBIN and to ensure all law enforcement agencies have access to NIBIN's correlation services, in particular the expansion of the NIBIN National Correlation and Training Center (NNCTC); to continue its work with intergovernmental partners, including DHS, toward these efforts, and encourages colocation with law enforcement partners where feasible. Due no later than 90 days after enactment. Due no later than February 28, 2023.
